Summary of the lesson

- 1- Children in different parts of our country travel to school in different ways.
- 2- In some parts of Assam, children need to cross bamboo and rope bridge to reach school.
- 3- Children in Ladakh use trolley to cross the river, and reach school
- 4- The trolley moves on strong iron ropes tied tightly to trees or rocks. A pulley helps the trolley to move across the rope.
- 5- Some bridges across a river are made of cement, bricks and iron rods.
- 6- In some parts of Kerala, children use a Vallam, which is a small wooden boat, to reach school.
- 7- In desert, children ride on camel carts to school.
- 8- In villages, bullock carts carry children to school.
- 9- In some places, children ride their own bicycle to school.
- 10- JUGAD is a vehicle made of waste materials. It looks like a motorcycle from the front while the back is made out of planks of wood.
- 11- In some areas, children cross thick and dark forest to reach school.
- 12- On hilly areas, children walk on ground covered with thick sheets of snow in winter.
- 13- One must be very careful while walking on snow. Our feet may sink into soft snow or slip on frozen snow.
- 14- In some mountains areas, the path is rocky and uneven. Children living in such areas can easily race up and down such difficult paths as they are habituated.
